Discussion/Direction

Ms. Dorothy Adams, Deputy Director, Salt Lake County Health Department, stated she was here to ask for an extension to the Emergency Declaration set to expire September 27, 2022. The Health Department would like to extend the declaration to October 13, 2022, to correspond with the Federal Government's public health emergency declaration. The Health Department is seeing stabilization of hospitalizations due to COVID-19, but it continues to see disparities in vaccine uptake and severe cases in the west side communities. It is continuing with its outreach efforts in those areas, and the County is still spending several hundred thousand dollars monthly in FEMA eligible expenditures. The Mayor's Office and Health Department feel extending the declaration is financially prudent.

Mr. Darrin Casper, Deputy Mayor of Finance and Administration, stated Mayor Finance continues to receive FEMA-eligible reimbursements. If the County is spending money on FEMA-related projects and the Federal government has the emergency declaration open, it seems prudent to consider extending the County's emergency declaration as well. He stated the resolution goes through January 3rd.

Council Member Theodore stated she could not believe the County was still using the emergency as an excuse to get these funds. She did not consider it to be a true emergency.

Council Member Alvord stated he shared Council Member Theodore's sentiments and asked if the County would be declaring an emergency today.

Mr. Mitchell Park, Legal Counsel, Council Office, stated it is the same emergency that was declared in March of 2020. County ordinance and State law require that if an emergency extends beyond thirty days, the legislative body must vote to continue that emergency. The County Council has done so twenty times so far. He read from County ordinance: *"A disaster or emergency means a situation causing or threatening to cause widespread damage or loss of life or significant property damage resulting from an attack, internal disturbance, natural phenomenon, public health emergency, or technological hazard."* He then stated a public health emergency is separately defined as *"an occurrence or imminent credible threat of an illness or health condition caused by including an epidemic or pandemic disease."*

A motion was made by Council Member Bradshaw, seconded by Council Member Winder Newton, that this agenda item be approved and forwarded to the 4:00 PM Council meeting for ratification. The motion carried by the following vote:
